The early Church baptized catechumens in the nude. This meant the newly baptized were leaving everything behind to the point that their behinds were uncovered. Baptizing females in the nude, therefore, was one of the functions of deaconesses, that lasted until infant Baptism came into vogue.¹ Rosemary Canavan argues that [You were buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead](#) is about a contrast expressed through clothing with the surrounding culture.²
